Jerry Moran was formerly Vice President of NMI Management and Training services, a training and consulting firm specializing in Organizational Development, Management, Training, Right of Way Training and Communications. He was nationally known as a right of way expert. His expertise was in environmental right of way, telecommunications and management skills training. He designed and developed numerous specialized training courses in Land and Easement Acquisition and Telecommunications, which he delivered nationally and internationally.

Mr. Moran was a right of way expert and was often used as an expert witness in court and with Jurispro, a company that maintains a list of expert witnesses for the legal community. He was the Manager of the Right of Way Department with Pacific Bell and AT&T for 25 years specializing in Right of way Acquisition, which included working in urban, rural areas and on Indian lands. He was also a past President of the International Right of way Association. He was also chosen as Professional of the Year in the Association in 1998.

PacBell moved Mr. Moran from San Diego, his home, to San Francisco to work on the breaking up of the Bell System and there remained after he married his wife, Esther.

He received an Excellence in Journalism award from The International Right of Way Association for several articles he published that appeared in national technical magazines. He also authored several classes taught in Land and Easement Acquisition to all types of utilities and governmental agencies for over 35 years. Mr. Moran was a motivational and guest speaker for Toastmasters International, National Cooperative Association, OPASTCO (The Promotion and Advancement of Small Telephone Companies) and the Western Energy Institute to name a few. He was also an adjunct instructor at the University of Wisconsin. He was very active in the San Diego Community College District and a past member of the Recreation and Leadership Advisory Committee, for which he was recognized with a special certificate for his accomplishments.
